- 25 Ms *Finlay* to move—That the House:—
 - (1) Notes:—
 - (a) fodder levels in Tasmania are extremely low;
 - (b) farmers experienced a poor fodder season in 2023;
 - (c) a very dry summer and autumn in 2024;
 - (d) the lack of feed is rapidly becoming a serious animal welfare issue in Tasmania;
 - (e) there is surplus feed available on mainland Australia;
 - (f) there will be competing interests for this surplus feed;
 - (g) farmers are willing and able to pay for feed;
 - (h) high freight costs to deliver feed across Bass Strait is a barrier for farmers;
 - (i) a number of vessels operating across Bass Strait are due to go into dry dock.
 - (2) Calls on the Tasmanian Government to act with urgency to support farmers with freight costs during this difficult time. (19 June 2024)
