Insert instead "7 of the Principal Act is amended by -

- (a) By omitting "prescribed", first occurring from subsection (1);
- inserting ", other than for a minor boundary extension," after (b) "reserve" in subsection (1); and
- by omitting everything after "granting of the application" in (c) subsection (1), and substituting "on a ground specified in paragraph (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) of section 8(2)"; and
- by omitting paragraphs (ab) and (b) from subsection (2) and (d) substituting the following paragraph:

(b) the ground for the objection is a ground specified in paragraph (a) , (b) , (c) , (d), (e) or (f) of section 8(2); and

A Debate arose thereupon.
